





Cut along the drawn line.






Part 3 Unit 5

General Instructions

All seams are scant 1/4" unless otherwise noted. Press seams as directed. Label units as they are completed to avoid confusion later in the construction.

Press seams open. Repeat to make a total of 126 (one hundred twenty-six) HSTs. Label these as A/C HSTs.

Cutting

From Fabric A, cut


• 10 (ten) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut 63 (sixty-three 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" squares.

From Fabric C, cut

• 10 (ten) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut 63 (sixty-three) 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" squares.

Making the Unit

1. On the back of **63 (sixty-four)** 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" Fabric A squares, draw a line along one diagonal.



3. On the back of 63 A/C HSTs, draw a line along one diagonal as shown.



4. Paying attention to orientation and nesting seams, layer a marked A/C HST with an unmarked A/C HST, right sides together. Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line.



Cut along the drawn line.



Press seam open. Trim the QST to 4-1/2" x 4-1/2". Be sure seams go through the corners of the trimmed units. Repeat to make a total of 126 QSTs. Label these as

Unit 5.


