
8. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric B square to each end of a 2" x 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward the Fabric B squares. Make 8.


9. Sew a piece made in Step 8 to the top and bottom of a piece made in Step 7. Press toward the piece made in Step 7. The block should measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2" This completes the Cross Block. Make 4.

### **Half Cross Block Construction**

1. Sew a 2" x 5" Fabric A rectangle to each end of a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric F rectangle. Press toward the Fabric F rectangle. Make 12.



2. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric D square to each end of a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward


Fabric D. Then, sew a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to each end of this piece. Press toward the Fabric D squares. Make 12.

3. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric B square to each end of a 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A Make 12 rectangle. Press toward Fabric B. Then, sew a 2" x 2" Fabric A square to each end of this piece. Press toward the Fabric B squares. Make 12.


4. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric B square to each end of a 2" x 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward Fabric B. Make 12.



5. Sew the pieces made in Steps 1-4 together consecutively to match the diagrams below. Press the rows in 8 of the blocks downwards, and press the rows in the remaining 4 blocks upwards. The block should measure 6-1/2" x 12-1/2". This completes the Half Cross Block.

### **Corner Block Construction**

1. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric F square to the left-hand side of a 2" x 5" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward the Fabric F square. Make 4.



2. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric D square to the right-hand side of a 2" x 2" Fabric A square. Press toward the Fabric A square. Then, sew a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the right-hand side of this piece. Press toward the Fabric D square. Make 4.




3. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric B square to the right-hand side of a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward the square. Then, sew a 2" x 2" Fabric A square to the right-hand side of this piece. Press toward the Fabric B square. Make 4.



4. Sew a 2" x 2" Fabric B square to the right-hand side of a 2" x 5" Fabric A rectangle. Press toward the Fabric B square. Make 4.



5. Sew the pieces made in Steps 1-4 together consecutively to match the diagram below. Press the seams **upwards**. The block should measure 6-1/2" x 6-1/2". This completes the Corner Block. Make 4.
